ABOUT PHILLIP ISLAND NATURE PARKS

Phillip Island Nature Parks was created by the State Government of Victoria in 1996 and comprises over 1,980 hectares of Crown Land set aside under the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978 'for the conservation of areas of natural interest or beauty or of scientific, historic or archaeological interest.'

As part of the UNESCO Western Port Biosphere Reserve, Phillip Island Nature Parks encompasses wildlife sanctuaries, wetlands, woodlands and breathtaking coastlines, which are protected and managed by world-renowned environmental and research programs.

Habitat within Phillip Island Nature Parks supports significant populations of little penguins, hooded plovers, short-tailed shearwaters and other international migratory bird species, and mammals such as koalas, possums, wallabies, Australian fur seals, bats, and Eastern barred bandicoots.

Also under the protection of the Nature Parks is a range of plant communities including more than 330 native species.

Phillip Island Nature Parks is an advanced ecotourism destination.

Phillip Island Nature Parks is a self-funded organisation. Revenue generated through ecotourism activities is invested into vital conservation, research, and education programs.



The Penguin Foundation raises funds to enhance Phillip Island's (Milawul) natural environment and protect native wildlife through research, rehabilitation, conservation, and education programs.

PENGUIN FOUNDATION

Priority projects include protecting our marine and coastal environment, future-proofing penguin health, rewilding the Island's flora, and saving threatened species from extinction. These projects are aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, which define global sustainable development priorities and aspirations for 2030 and serve as a universal framework to foster global collaboration to solve the world's most challenging tasks in sustainability.

Currently, the Penguin Foundation is funding crucial research and strategic revegetation efforts to improve habitat in core penguin areas that are at 'high risk' during heat events. This includes areas where penguins have experienced high mortality during recent heatwaves, as part of the 'Future-Proofing Little Penguins' project.

Donors can contribute to this work through our giving programs, including the Adopt an Animal program. Support is also provided through grants, corporate partnerships, events, corporate team days and bequests.

Since its establishment in 2006, the Penguin Foundation has raised over AU \$3.4 million so far.
